We were founded in 1922 when we first started assisting blind and partially sighted soldiers returning from war and we have continued to help people in Surrey who are Deaf, or have a sight or hearing impairment. People are at the heart of everything we do. We champion independence, where people thrive in their communities and achieve their aspirations. We offer expert support, services, and advice across Surrey, delivering our services to over 8,000 people in homes, communities, and from our main office hub.

How we help

People who are Deaf, or have a sight or hearing impairment, can unfortunately become incredibly isolated but our specialist teams of qualified and skilled professionals support each individual by arming them with the **knowledge**, **equipment** and **confidence** to live and work fulfilling and independent lives.

Vision Impaired Services

We are there to support people who are losing their sight, and those registered blind or partially sighted, with practical help for day to day living throughout a person's lifetime. We

work in local hospitals where our Eye Clinic Liaison Officers (ECLOs) will expertly guide them through the process of accessing the right benefits and services to help make life easier. They also provide much needed emotional and practical support that comes with vision impairment, whether the individual is born with an impairment or blind, or it is acquired later in life.



Our specialist rehabilitation workers deliver bespoke support so people can learn life skills to help them on a

daily basis. For example a route to the supermarket or their favourite takeaway, or how to prepare and cook a meal. We also have Vision Impaired Support Workers to support blind and partially sighted people with their daily activities such as food shopping, medical appointments and leisure activities.



Technology Support

We also provide IT assistance to anyone who is blind or partially sighted. We show them how to use software on their phone, computer and other devices to help them to

be independent and stay connected with family and friends and upskill in technology.

Sensory Impairment Resource Centre

We have a showroom in the heart of Surrey with a large selection of hearing and low vision equipment with experts to help people find the most

useful and suitable equipment for their needs. Deaf Services

We provide specialist social work services and community support to all Deaf adults over the age of 18 in Surrey. The Deaf services team of qualified social workers

and community officers work with Deaf individuals, families, or carers to help people access everything they need.

Our specialist social workers have detailed knowledge and understanding of the issues that can affect a person who is Deaf and they have the skills and experience to work with Deaf people, whatever their choice of communication.



Interpreting Communications

We provide a range of communication professionals for people who are Deaf, deafened, deafblind, hard of hearing and those with combined sight and hearing loss in order to meet their communication needs.



From Communicator Guides and British Sign Language interpretation to haptic communication, we've got it covered.



Hard of Hearing Services

Our Hearing Loss Advisors provide information and support to assist people to manage their hearing impairment. The specialist team work with individuals, families and groups providing information about hearing loss, communication skills training, equipment and technology support.



Deafblind Services

In addition to our other sensory services, we have specialist Communicator Guides to support deafblind people so their impairment does not become a barrier to understanding and being understood.

Our qualified Communicator Guides use a range of communication methods including 'hands on finger signing' and haptic communication. We run events for deafblind people so they can experience the same activities as hearing and sighted people. We have a social intervener service that assists young people with combined sight and hearing loss as they mature, helping them to develop their interests and independence.





Children and Young People

We help children and young people who are blind or partially sighted to maximise their life opportunities. Our qualified and experienced team ensures that children and young people

with vision impairment or multi-sensory impairment, and their families, receive a creative and innovative service that will help each child to reach their full potential and experience life as an independent individual. This is achieved through a programme of individual training and group recreational activities to suit all ages, including family support.

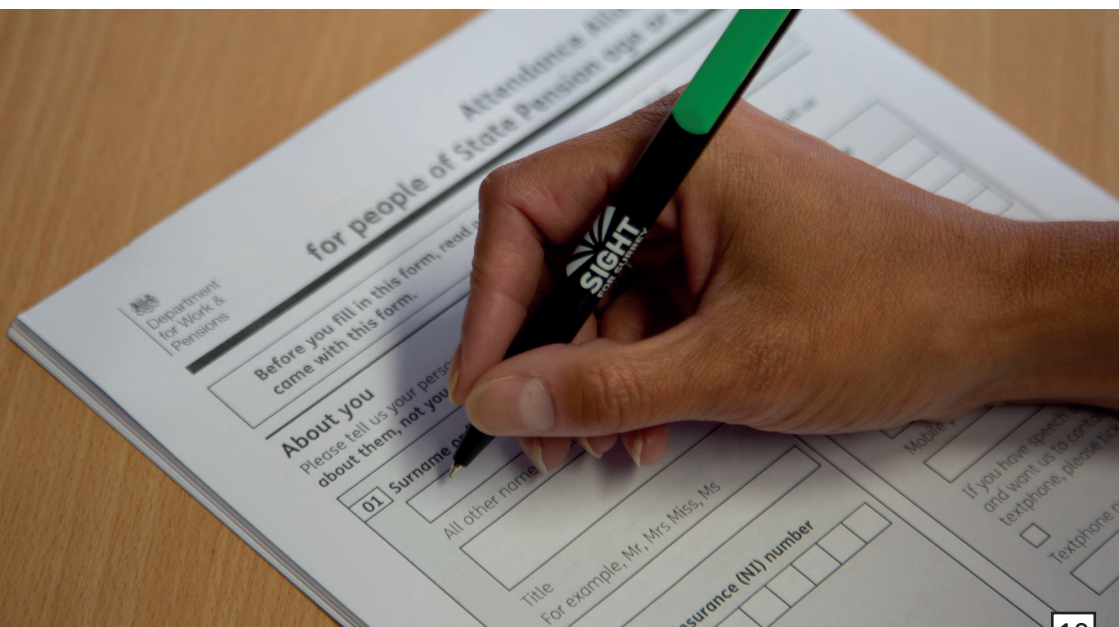


Advice, Information and Benefits
